


HOW TO BUILD A HUG

One day, Temple had an idea. If she couldn't receive a hug, she would make one...she would build a hug machine!




RULES

Frustrated at life with an autistic brother, twelve-year-old Catherine longs for a normal existence but her world is further complicated by a friendship with a young paraplegic.




A BOY AND A JAGUAR

The renowned cat conservationist reflects on his early childhood struggles with a speech disorder, describing how he only spoke fluently when he was communicating with animals.




FISH IN A TREE

Gloria loves to sing and play with her friends, but her Big Problem follows her around and tells her that she can't.




WE COULD BE HEROES




BALLOONS FOR PAPA

Brimming with affecting and poignant words, beautiful black-and-white illustrations, and bursts of color on every page, this book sends the message that even in the worst situations, there is light and love.




COUNTING BY 7S
